



COMMUNITY PROFILE




The total population of Orange is 19,834. The median age is 34.36.


INCOME AND SPENDING



HOUSING

There are 11% more households who own their homes than there are renters.



Two significant residential developments, Little Cypress Grove and the Reserve at Mallard Lakes, have entered their second phase of development. Once fully built out, these projects are expected to bring approximately 400 new homes, contributing to the city's ongoing growth. Both projects are located north of the interstate.

TRANSPORTATION
